


The Evidence Is Clear: Systematic Election Fraud

1 Statistical Anomalies and Implausible Outcomes:

Sharp Discrepancies Across Election Day, Early Voting, and Mail-In Ballots (Figure 2)

The Outcome: The Democratic Party (DPK) won 98% of early voting across 3,500 districts nationwide—a statistical anomaly that points to systemic manipulation.

2 Physical Proof of Manipulation

- **Pristine Ballots:** Thousands of ballots found with no fold marks, appearing freshly printed and machine-stacked. (Figure 3)
- **Stuck-together Sheets:** Multiple ballots discovered still attached as if they came straight from a printing press, not voters. (Figure 4)


Figure 5 Mass Ballots

- **Mass Ballots:** Bundles of ballots found inside boxes as if cast by a single person in bulk. (Figure 5)
- **Insecure Infrastructure:** Use of non-transparent fabric bags, limiting visibility compared to standard ballot boxes. (Figure 6)

3 Lack of Oversight

The National Election Commission (NEC) refused to use legally required personal seals of officials, instead opting for printed electronic images—undermining authentication safeguards and enabling the risk of mass forgery.

A Broken System of Checks and Balances

✓ The National Election Commission (NEC) is an Untouchable Entity.

- **Self-Judging Judiciary:** Supreme Court justices and regional judges serve as NEC chairs—an absurd, self-judging system in election lawsuits.
- **Investigative Paralysis:** Police and prosecutors refuse to investigate criminal complaints regarding election fraud.
- **Violating the Law:** Courts ignore the 180-day mandatory deadline for resolving election lawsuits, causing indefinite delays.
- **Legislative Subservience:** Lawmakers remain "hostages" to the NEC, which holds absolute power over their political survival.
- **"Family Business" Corruption:** Nearly 1,200 cases of illegal preferential hiring and nepotism have been uncovered within the NEC.

Why the U.S. Must Stand for Election Integrity in Korea

- **Global Threat:** Election fraud is global. Korea's digital systems are linked to international networks like A-WEB and reflect patterns seen in disputed elections worldwide.
- **Strategic Alliance:** South Korea is a frontline Indo-Pacific ally. If its democracy falls to rigged elections, U.S. security interests against China, Russia, and North Korea will be severely compromised.
- **Blood Allies:** We share a history of fighting for freedom. We must now defend the integrity of the vote together to secure the future of the Free World.

How the U.S. Can Help Secure Election Integrity



Prevent Real-time Manipulation:

Mandate international monitoring to prevent unauthorized access and real-time data manipulation throughout the entire election process from early voting to final ballot counting.



Sanctions on Corruption:

Impose sanctions on individuals and entities involved in undermining democratic elections.



International Investigation:

Demand a transparent international audit of South Korea's digital voting systems.
